

VIZHINJAM PORT: TRANSFORMING INDIA'S MARITIME LANDSCAPE

MBA 2023-25 Logistics & Supply Chain Management

Vizhinjam Port, India's first transshipment port, is near the southern tip of Kerala. It's seen as a transformative project for India's maritime sector due to its strategic location and potential economic impact. The Union Minister of Ports, Shipping & Waterways, Shri Sarbananda Sonowal received the first Mother Ship 'MV San Fernando' marking the beginning of operation at Vizhinjam port.



Strategically located just 10 nautical miles from the busy international shipping route connecting Europe, the Persian Gulf and the Far East, Vizhinjam enjoys inherent locational advantages that position it for success as a global transshipment hub. The port's close proximity to the East-West axis of global maritime trade ensures convenient, direct access for large vessels without needing to deviate from their routes.

Gifted by nature with a deep draft of 18m close to shore that requires no capital dredging, Vizhinjam can leverage its natural depth to host even ultra-large next-gen container ships requiring 20m+ drafts. It is the deepest port in India and the 3rd deepest in the world. Its curvilinear coast mitigates tsunami impact while the port's positioning results in only mild erosion, minimizing maintenance costs. With capacity for 18,000+ TEU ships, scalable infrastructure to match cargo growth and minimal siltation, Vizhinjam is future ready.

Once fully operational, Vizhinjam Port is expected to boost the local and national economy by creating jobs, fostering trade, and attracting foreign investment. The port is envisioned to handle up to 3 million TEUs (twenty-foot equivalent units) annually, which would alleviate congestion at other major Indian ports and position India as a competitive player in the global shipping industry. It is a state owned port, owned by the Government of Kerala and will be operated by the Adani Group for a period of 40 years.

VIZHINJAM PORT: A GATEWAY TO PROSPERITY AND CAREER OPPORTUNITIES FOR MBA GRADUATES

Sited in the vicinity of Kerala's tech-hub Thiruvananthapuram; Vizhinjam International Deepwater Multipurpose Seaport is planning to transform India's maritime economy, forever. Vizhinjam is located a few kilometres from the Arabian Sea and possesses one of India's best natural port depths. It can be developed as an ideal transhipment port given its proximity to international sea routes, being close to major east-west trade lanes passing through Malacca straits-it sweetens their plans for Vizhinjam Port with access to high-frequency shipping lines connecting Europe, Africa, Middle East



Asia-America region. The Adani Group is the key initiator of this massive project, which aims to boost trade and generate many jobs for MBA graduates.

Due to its strategic location along a busy international route for over 70 per cent of India's trade by volume, the Vizhinjam Port is quite important. Being capable of handling mega-ships, the port will help reduce cargo traffic congestion at other ports in and around Delhi/NCR and bring down logistics costs for exporters and importers, thereby improving India's global trade competitiveness.

State-of-the-art infrastructure and advanced cargo handling & storage facilities will be key features in the port entering into a central global supply chain network node. This will result in a massive expansion of second-level industries like logistics, warehousing, and transport. Operations management will ensure seamless logistics, optimise supply chain processes, and manage day-to-day activities. Financial management roles will involve financial planning, budgeting, investment analysis, and risk management. Marketing specialists can help promote the port's facilities and attract shipping lines and logistics companies. HR professionals will manage recruitment, training, and development programs. Sustainability experts can lead initiatives ensuring environmentally friendly operations and manage corporate social responsibility (CSR) programs. Proficiency in industry trends, digital tools, and management practices will be foundational. Post-graduate programs and specialised courses, such as the MBA in logistics, finance, etc., can help to give an edge over other aspirants. Employment prospects may be improved by networking with professionals and pursuing relevant internships in port operations.



Vizhinjam Port will change the game and provide an economic stimulus to the Indian maritime sector. For graduates in the field of business administration, there are numerous job opportunities available at the port. The port is growing, and the jobs are increasing daily. It requires skilled talents to develop its growth and, in turn, the development of the economy region. 
